Halloween Facts

Halloween is a holiday with a long history.
The name Halloween is a shorter version of
All Hallows' Eve or the night before All
Saints Day. It is celebrated in October 31st.
Kids dress -up in scary costumes and go
Trick-or-treating.



In Mexico, they celebrate All Souls Day also known as Dias de Los Muertos or Day of the Dead on November 2nd. It is a big celebration that honours family and friends who have passed away.



- The Celts believed in this story of Jack Stingy, so they began to place Jack o' Lanterns outside their houses. The purpose was to guide lost souls home while they wandered during the Samhain festival eve.
- Initially the Jack o' Lanterns were carved out from potatoes & turnips but after the potatoes famine people began to use pumpkin instead.

Halloween goes back to an ancient Celtic celebration in Ireland and Scotland called Samhain. Samhain marked the end of summer. People at the time were frightened of evil spirits. They would dress up in costumes and make noise in the streets in order to make the spirits go away.



Trick or treat history is usually connected to the old custom of souling.

In souling, the poor will go from house to house to beg for soul cakes. In return of the soul cakes the beggars would pray for those members of the family who were recently dead.

Soul cakes were round in shape and were made from bread with currants.



Story time

The Legend of "Stingy Jack"

People have been making jack-o'-lanterns at Halloween for centuries. The practice originated from an Irish myth about a man nicknamed "Stingy Jack." According to the story, Stingy Jack invited the Devil to have a drink with him. True to his name, Stingy Jack didn't want to pay for his drink, so he convinced the Devil to turn himself into a coin that Jack could use to buy their drinks. Once the Devil did so, Jack decided to keep the money and put it into his pocket next to a silver cross, which prevented the Devil from changing back into his original form.

Jack eventually freed the Devil, under the condition that he would not bother Jack for one year and that, should Jack die, he would not claim his soul. The next year, Jack again tricked the Devil into climbing into a tree to pick a piece of fruit. While he was up in the tree, Jack carved a sign of the cross into the tree's bark so that the Devil could not come down until the Devil promised Jack not to bother him for ten more years.

Soon after, Jack died. As the legend goes, God would not allow such an unsavoury figure into heaven. The Devil, upset by the trick Jack had played on him and keeping his word not to claim his soul, would not allow Jack into hell. He sent Jack off into the dark night with only a burning coal to light his way. Jack put the coal into a carved-out turnip and has been roaming the Earth with ever since. The Irish began to refer to this ghostly figure as "Jack of the Lantern," and then, simply "JacO'Lantern."

Roll 10 - Draw a part that is missing from someone else's pumpkin on theirs.


Roll 11 - The next player gets 2 turns!

Ghost chain



Materials:

- paper
- scissors
- tape

Instructions:

- Cut a 6-inch-wide strip out of as many pieces of white construction paper or white printer paper as you want. The more pieces of paper you cut, the longer the chain will be. I used 4 pieces of construction paper.
- You can either keep these pieces of construction paper separate and make a few small chains and attach them at the end or attach the pieces of paper before making one long chain. If you choose to do the second method the paper might be very hard to cut, especially for younger kids.
- If you are keeping the pieces of paper separate, fold each piece like an accordion. If you aren't keeping them together, still fold the long strip of paper like an accordion.
- Make the folds the width or a bit less than the template pieces, around 2 and 1/2 inches.
- Trace the template piece onto the top fold of each of the pieces of paper or the long strip of paper.
- Cut out -- make sure you don't cut through the folds at the very edge of the image (in the case of the ghost, the hands).
- If you kept the pieces of paper separate, you will have a few small chains. Tape together all of your small chains to make one big chain

FUNNY GHOST

Instructions:



Draw a picture of a large ghost on the paper.



Using a glue stick coat the inside of the ghost and stick cotton balls all over it until it is covered.





Have your child cut out two ghost eyes and a mouth from the felt, and glue these on the ghost. You can also have eyes and a mouth already cut if they aren't comfortable with cutting yet.

HOW TO MAKE A PAPER BOWL BAT CRAFT



INSTRUCTIONS FOR MAKING BAT CRAFT

Step 1: Paint the bottom of your paper bowl with black paint. Let it dry completely.

Step 2: Use our free printable template to trace and cut out the bat wings, ears and fangs from black and white cardstock paper or construction paper.



Step 3: Glue a bag wing on each side of the paper bowl. Then glue googly eyes and the fangs onto the paper bowl.

Step 4: Finish your Halloween bat craft by gluing the ears at the top of the paper bowl.

HOW TO MAKE A PAPER BOWL PUMPKIN CRAFT



INSTRUCTIONS FOR MAKING JACK-O-LANTERN CRAFT

Step 1: Paint the bottom of your paper bowl with orange paint. Set it aside to dry completely.

Step 2: Use our free printable template to trace and cut out the Jack-o-Lantern face pieces from black construction paper or cardstock. Glue the eyes, nose and mouth onto the back of the painted bowl.



Step 3: Cut a rectangle pumpkin stem from brown cardstock or construction paper and glue it at the top of your pumpkin.

Step 4: Wrap a green pipe cleaner around your finger to make a curly pumpkin vine. Punch a hole next to the pumpkin stem with a hole punch. Place the end of the curly green pipe cleaner into the hole and wrap it around itself to secure it in place.

Mummy Wraps



Ingredients

- 1 Mission Mini Wrap
- 2 tbs peanut butter
- 1 banana
- 4 sultanas

Method

- Spread the peanut butter on a wrap.
- Cut the wrap into skinny strips.
- Peel a banana and cut in half.
- Wrap a peanut butter strip around the banana.
- For the eyes, dab peanut butter on the sultana and press onto banana.

Frozen banana ghosts



These frozen banana ghosts are the perfect Halloween party snack. Scare your guests with these cute but creepy bites. Trick or treat!


Ingredients


- 4 firm bananas cut into thirds
- 200g white chocolate, melted in a double boiler
- 24 milk or dark chocolate chips
- 1 cup desiccated coconut

Method

- Gently insert popsicle sticks into banana pieces, leaving a 1-2cm margin at the top so that the stick does not poke through the other end of the banana.
- Dip and swirl each stick of banana into the melted chocolate and allow any
 excess melted chocolate to drip back into the bowl. Place each dipped banana in
 either a cake pop stand or flat onto a tray lined with baking paper.
- Once the chocolate has almost set, press 2 chocolate chips into the banana for the eyes. Gently roll each banana through a bowl of desiccated coconut, so that it is fully coated. Place back in cake pop stand on lined tray.
- Freeze bananas until ready to eat. Consume within 2 months.
















Colour by number
