60 young people aged 8 to 15 years of age availed of this bumper packed programme.



Trick or treat... here we have the Inbetweenagers enjoying their annual Halloween party.



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
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4: CAUSEWAY YOUTH EXCHANGE

6: BEYOND LABELS

LGBTI+ rights and visibility youth exchange 02-10/09/2018, Dublin

The youth exchange BEYOND LABELS is part of a Human Rights Education programme "STAY HUMAN 3" that has involved around 180 young people from all over the EU. The exchange focused on LGBTI+ rights and campaigning. It brought together 40 young people from the Talk About Youth Project, the Netherlands, Spain, Slovenia, Lithuania and Romania to Dublin. The main aim was to learn how to raise awareness on LGBT+ issues and to promote our own



campaign "DEAR ME", which was developed over a year ago by our LGBTI+ Youth Group "ALLSORTS".



7: LIFE CHOICE PROGRAMME


By now I'm sure you are aware that the Talk About Youth Project is home to 5 simulator babies. The babies were handed over to local young women, who cared for them for 2 nights. Taking home a baby is a beneficial experience for our young people, however the work which precedes it is of even greater benefit. It is a sex and relationships and life skills programme. It addresses issues like the effects of drugs and alcohol in pregnancy, peer pressure, contraception, STI's and the financial, aspirational and emotional consequences of having a baby.

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8: LGBTI + UNDER 18 YEARS DROP IN

We are delighted to be opening our doors for our first ever, under 18yrs LGBTI+ Youth Group. The doors were opened on Monday 12th November between 7 - 9 p.m. in the Junction. This will be a safe and inclusive space for young people to come together and have fun. The group will be supported by our Allsorts LGBTI+





9: OUR VOICE PROJECT

The "Our Voice" integration project was run in partnership with the Irish Refugee Council to represent and



promote the voices of young people from migrant and non-migrant communities. The project aimed to strengthen connections between young people and celebrate diversity.

The project brought together 20 young people from different backgrounds to get to know each other, share their experiences and stories. The young people collaborated for 6 months including a 5 day trip to Sherkin Island where they produced a film, song and stories to help promote a more inclusive world.
